

A Survey of the Parish of Horsell in the County of Surrey 1834 before the coming of the railway (2283/7/1)

This survey at Surrey History Centre is potentially useful since it relates to a time before the coming of the railway to Woking in 1838 when Horsell was a small village to the north of Woking then on its original site which we now call Old Woking. Details are provided of the owner, occupier, description and measurements in acres, roods and perches of all land in the village split between the Church and Sithwood Ends of the Parish. Edward Ryde's 1851 map, also at Surrey History Centre, helps with the interpretation of the survey in that this later record shows the location of all named fields in the village. For this reason a further column has been added to this transcription showing the corresponding plot no. on the Ryde map where the entry in the 1834 survey can be reconciled with that in the Book of Reference accompanying the map. This additional information is only a suggestion and it would be wise for researchers to make their own decisions as to whether it is possible to reconcile one entry with another.

There are, however, difficulties in reconciling the entries in the two sources in that the 1834 entries are often difficult to read and the spelling of the names of particular fields may vary from one source to the other. Moreover, the measurements of fields are not always identical. This may be because fields have been split or parts sold. Transcription has also not been helped by pencilled and inked alterations possibly due to fields having been sold or owners or occupiers having died. It is wise, therefore, to refer to the original survey before relying on the transcription below. Not all the pencil and ink amendments have been transcribed as the original unaltered ink text is assumed to represent the original 1834 survey.

There was nothing unique in the names given to particular fields. The names referred to the situation, size, use and appearance of a field. *Barn field* would describe a field adjacent to a barn, *Six acres* would refer to a field of that size although this might be an over estimate possibly due to part of the field being sold. In Horsell a meadow close to a water course might be called *Littlewick Brook* or it might have *mead* in its title as in *6 Acre mead*, the word being another name for meadow. *Long Field* and *Shoulder (of mutton) Field* are examples of fields described by their appearance. Where a number of adjacent farms had fields of the same name, this might indicate that a large field had been split between a number of owners.

Some fields have names which reflect possible previous use. *Kiln Field* might indicate previous brick making and *Vineyard*, use for grape cultivation. A previous owner's name may have lingered in a field's name as in the

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case of *Smith Field*. *Church Field* could just be a field adjacent to the church or a field where the produce or profit from which was reserved for the church. There are an almost unlimited number of possible derivations. Although there is nothing unique about field names in general, it would be unusual but not impossible for two fields on one farm to be given the same name. The agricultural revolution led to an increase in the number of fields which could be administered from a single farmhouse as a result of which some farmhouses ceased to be inhabited by a single farmer and were used instead to accommodate farm labourers. The transcription is marked *1841 labourers* where the Census shows this change of use. This trend also affected Horsell but probably more farms in the village became market gardens or nurseries particularly as Knaphill was originally in Horsell parish.

Helpfully, the cottages in the Parish are listed, with their occupants, in addition to the larger land holdings and it is, therefore, possible to compare the occupants with those shown in the Edward Ryde 1851 survey. Where it is possible to do so the corresponding 1851 plot no in an added column. A further aid to the interpretation of the survey are the Land Tax returns 1780 – 1832 which provide further information of land holding in the village during that time.

I am grateful to my friend John Craig for having compared my transcription with the original as a result of which I have been able to correct a number of errors. Having examined the original, John has identified several miscalculations which are shown in **brown bold** as footnotes in this Second Edition.
