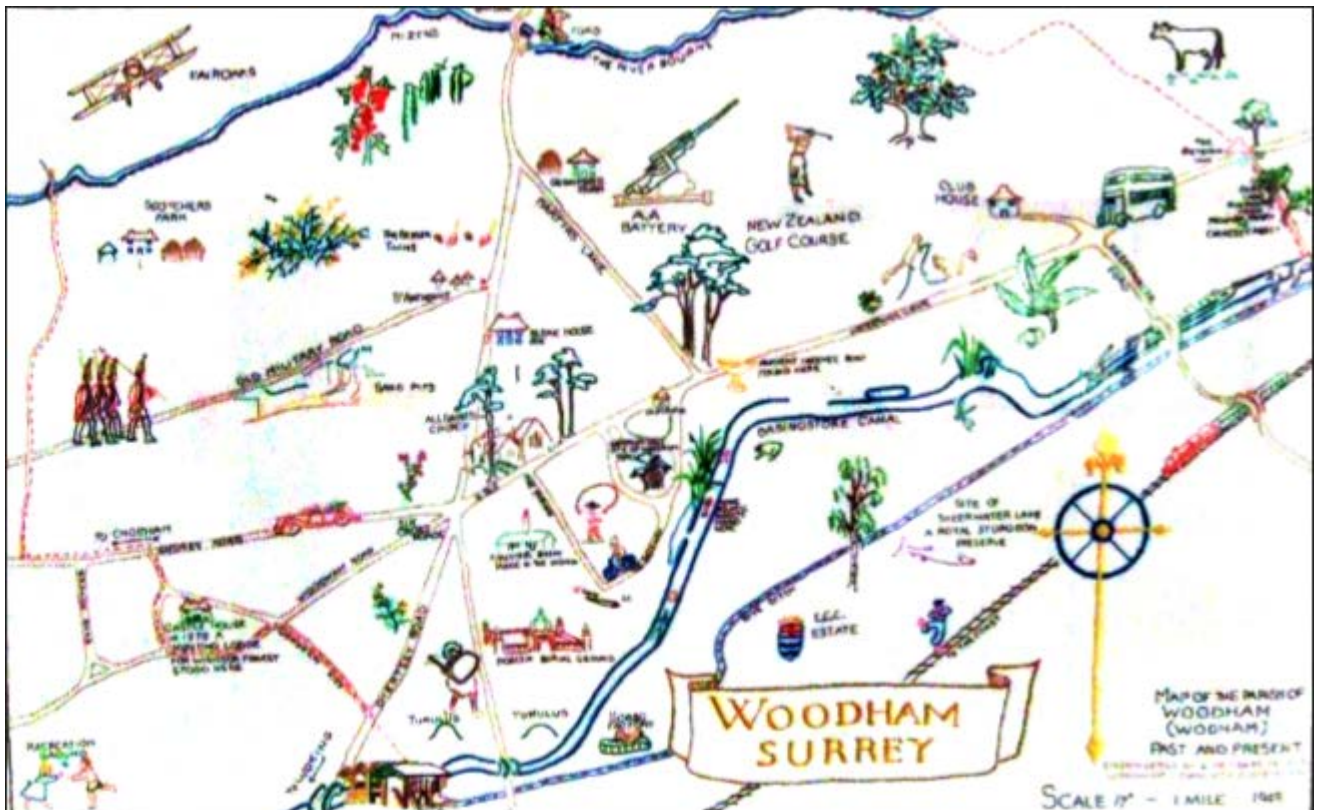


The Woodham Parish Map



All Saints' parish was created out of those of Horsell, Addlestone and a small portion of Christ Church Woking and was consecrated by the Bishop of Winchester in 1902. The parish is divided in two by the Basingstoke Canal

In 1951 a number of Woodham residents decided to emulate the Festival of Britain by having a Festival of Woodham with the big project of creating a tapestry of Woodham parish. Amongst the instigators were Woking artist Marguerite Howarth (1908-2001) and her husband, Harold - both members of the All Saints' congregation. The nascent work spent a considerable amount of time at their house and their three children contributed to the tapestry - the idea being that the project should be the work of a number of local residents.

Among those involved in addition to the Howarth family were the Stone family, Shirley Hand, Margaret Mizen and the Jourdain family. The finished map can now be seen in the Church Hall.
